### **3. ACADEMIC RESILIENCE – CATHERINE BOLAND**

Catherine is a consultant clinical psychologist to the University of New South Wales and also works in private practice.. A sample of her input:

- Resilience is a set of qualities that foster a process of successful adaptation and transformation despite risk and adversity.
- The current wish for many parents is for their children to have a childhood devoid of risk and adversity.
- Fundamental to the resilience of a child is a strong attachment relationship with an adult.

- Teachers and schools are often crucial in offering an attachment relationship to young people.
- Failing to live up to potential may be associated to an inability to take risks.
- To improve, one must work at the edge of one's competence, and that always involves risk.

#### **5. ACADEMIC CARE AND ACADEMIC RESILIENCE – ANN NADGE**

Ann is Deputy Principal at St Catherine's School, Waverley. Her presentation was about a major action research project at Waverley which began as a desire to have all teachers understand their pastoral role. Interest was in the hours the students are in the care of teachers while they are in classes, at school. The intended outcome of the project several years later is expressed as “Academic care involves promoting well-being through academic structures and processes which are sympathetic to adolescent needs.”
